This week starts with significant news:

...The majority of negative accountability issues in the various scholarship expansion (Corporate Tax Credit/Step-Up, McKay, & Gardiner) bills have been removed; are in an agreed revised posture, or have been modified to multiple inclusive Proposed Committee Bills (PCB's...click here to see EDC1 lines 941-944, that directly benefits Dual Enrollment objectives). The Proposed Committee Bill was taken up last Thursday and passed to the next committee of assignment.

...The Companion Dual Enrollment bill SB1064 by Baxley is being heard in the Senate this date and is expected to pass; however please note: Democratic Senators in Broward County need to hear from private & Christian schools in this district that want to access dual enrollment. These include Senators: Book 850-487-5032, Farmer 850-487-5034, Thurston 850-487-5055. Simply reach their aides in the respective Tallahassee Office with a simple message of a request of support for Baxley's Bill in Senate Education Committee at 4:00 PM today. The only positive issues to discuss is this allows a return to an "equitable (equal access) and non-discriminatory," option for the students of tax paying parents. There are only four hours to make this contact.

...**The McKay Bills HB 829** by Plasencia was amended and passed by the PreK-12 Innovation Subcommittee with unanimous (<u>12-0</u>) bipartisan support January 23rd. The measure reduces the prior-public-school-attendance requirement from a year to a semester or less for kindergarten to 12th grade students seeking to participate in the McKay Scholarship Program for Students with Disabilities. The Senate companion, **SB 1080**, which removes the prior-year requirement in its entirety for grades K-5 is set to advance.

...**The Hope Scholarship bill** (HB1) and Senate companion is moving but have a number of positive modifications though it is very doubtful due to all the potential separation of church & state issues that a Christian school would want to entangle themselves by receiving students under this option. The legislation is moving in both Houses.

Below is a listing of all legislation of concern to Christian schools. *However it is in a form that only shows action on bills taken up since the last Capital Update.* Additionally due to the Calendar of the Legislature there are a variety of bills listed that are running out of time to be heard in their first committee of assignment (HB347/SB66 on sexual orientation & gender identity; HB211/SB588 criminalizing perceived prejudice based on gender identity & SB178 reclassifying crimes related to the above and beyond). Unless there is a PCB and multiple combinations of related legislation already taken up by a committee in the next week, the ability of a single bill, even with a companion, will be unlikely, especially if there is also a potential fiscal impact due to the legislative outcome if passed.
